

## Beginning NT Greek - Chapter 1-4: Homework

- Below is a suggested list of steps for doing your homework this week.
- Plan on spending a *minimum* of 30 minutes each day to complete everything. You may require longer.
- Try to establish a block of time every day at the same time and work through the material systematically.
- Don't cram all your studying (especially memory work) on the last day!

### I. Mounce, Grammar:

- A. Study Chap. 1: "The Greek Language"
- B. Study Chap. 2: "Learning Greek". (see "Memorizing NT Greek" handout)
- C. Study Chap. 3: "The Alphabet and Pronunciation":
  1. Review "Alphabet and Pronunciation" handout.
  2. Memorize Greek alphabet orally by grouping the letters; e.g., α β γ δ ε - ζ η θ - ι κ λ - μ ν ξ ο π - ρ σ τ υ - φ χ ψ ω
  3. Memorize Greek alphabet so you can write it down without hesitation!
  4. Use "Alphabet Practice Worksheet" handout for written practice.
  5. Review "Vowels, Diphthongs, & Textual Marks" handout.
- D. Study Chap. 4: "Punctuation and Syllabification":
  1. Practice writing out the vocabulary words on pages 18-19.
  2. Say them as you write them out.

### II. Mounce, Workbook:

- A. Do Exercise 3: "The Alphabet and Pronunciation"
- B. Do Exercise 4: "Punctuation and Syllabification"

### III. EXTRA

- A. Practice reading the first five to ten verses of John with the tape. (Use the handout)
- B. Write out the following Bible Memory Verses and memorize in Greek and in English. Pay careful attention to breathings and accent marks.

Ἐν ἀρχῇ ἦν ὁ λόγος, καὶ ὁ λόγος ἦν  
In [the] beginning was the word and the word was

πρὸς τὸν θεόν, καὶ θεὸς ἦν ὁ λόγος.  
with (the\*) God and God was the word.

\* Keep in mind that Greek uses articles differently from English.

\*\* Because there is no article (the) this is part of the predicate. Keep in mind that word order in Greek is often very different from English.
